Estate: Von Buhl estate started producing world-class wines in 1849. It was a von Buhl wine that was served to toast the opening of the Suez Canal. Today, internationally recognized von Buhl estate is one of the leading estates of the Pfalz region.

Tasting Note: The fine color catches your eye the first time you look at it. Blended from a mixture of first press and Saignée juice, the red fruity aromas are typical and bring to mind raspberry and strawberry. Soft elegance and a lively structure come together in our Rosé year after year.

Saignée: a Rosé can be produced as a by-product of red wine fermentation using a technique known as *Saignée* (from French bleeding). When a winemaker desires to impart more tannin and color in red wine, some of the pink juice from the must may be removed at an early stage. The red wine remaining in the vats is intensified as a result of the bleeding, because the volume of juice in the must is reduced, and the must involved in the maceration is concentrated. The pink juice that is removed can be fermented separately as rosé.
